### Classroom Activities:

- Leaf Descriptions Collect leaves (or print photos). Students
   describe them using adjectives (big, small, crunchy, red, golden)
- Learn and dramatise a poem about the seasons of the year (e.g. poem "Spring to winter")

### 4th of October World Animal Day

#### Classroom Activities:

- Old MacDonald had a farm (nursery rhyme): practise animal words and noises
- Read a book about animals (e.g. Dear Zoo) and then write a letter to the zoo asking for a pet / complaining about the pet they received.
- Who's in the Zoo? Song Adapt a simple chant: "Who's in the zoo? Who's in the zoo? I see a monkey, how about you?"

- Rumble in the Jungle, by Giles Andreae
- Over in the Jungle: A Rainforest Rhyme, by Marianne Berkes

## 5th of October World Smile Day

#### Classroom Activities:

- "Compliment cards" give one to a classmate.
- Make a smile collage with student photos.
- Smile Poems Create short class acrostics with SMILE
- Sing "If You're Happy and You Know It" Adapt verses: "If you're happy and you know it, show your smile..."

## 16th of October World Food Day



#### Classroom Activities:

- Listen to a song about food (e.g. Eric Carle's Today is Monday)
- Prepare a healthy meal: draw and describe a healthy lunch.
- Food Flags Make world flags out of pictures of food.
- Class Recipe Book Each student contributes a favourite food.
  - Collect into a mini-book "Our World Food Day Recipes".
